MAINT.REPORT (10) new cedar octagon street light poles have been ordered. The crew seals pole base (3 ft) the area buried in the ground to retard the decay between wood and soil. The crew sealcoats each upper exposed wood with CWF (clear wood finish) to promote more resistance to yearly weather conditions. The light fixture head on the pole in front of # 22 Carlton was changed to an L.E.D light. This increased the night lighting (LUMENS) over the older (175

watt) metal halide bulb. The new L.E.D. uses 63 watts. The new poles should arrive next week. The crew replaced the stainless-steel tool cabinet on the Ford dump truck. The cabinet was removed so that an electric short to the backup alarm wiring could be easily accessible and the rear cab window had to be replaced. Repairs are in progress and some has been completed on Cobble stone curbing. This was done on Merrivale Road and Wensely Drive. Some of the reset cobblestone was also done in preparation for proposed road repaving. There are 3 locations that are slated to have road repaving curb to curb. The DPW Supervisor has met with Mayor Miller and Jim Pratt of Pratt Construction, twice, to review (3) locations within the Village to get the best estimate for this project. Some of the work Jim Pratt will do includes restoring some curb at the end of Melbourne Road by the apartment houses. The village does plan to replant trees. Sycamores, Sugar Maples and Sunburst Locus are the choices, if available this time of year. Neal's Tree Service is in at times to finish removing Village Trees that were damaged from the last hurricane.

Mayor Miller made the following comments:

• The tennis courts will be open through October and into November weather permitting.
